Dave earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in Mathematics from Randolph-Macon College in 1981. His professional career started with Best Products Catalog Showroom in Richmond, Virginia in the Merchandising Department from 1981-1989 where he held buying positions in the Jewelry area for 8 years.

He moved to Town and Country Manufacturing Company in Boston, MA from 1989-1992, where he served as Vice President of Product Development for a multi-national manufacturer in the jewelry industry.

In 1992, Dave moved to Ft. Lauderdale, Florida to work for Aurafin Corporation, a manufacturer/distributor of jewelry products, as Vice President of Sales and Marketing. In 1998, Dave became President/CEO and partner in the business. In 2007, he sold the business to Berkshire Hathaway, forming the Richline Group as part of Berkshire Hathaway. Since 2007, Dave has operated Richline Group for Berkshire as President, expanding the business to a global operation based in New York, Florida, Massachusetts, Europe, Asia, South America and Africa. In 2018 Dave also assumed the role of CEO of the Richline Group of companies for Berkshire.

Dave has been married to his wife Dee 40 years and they have three children.

In his personal time Dave enjoys his family, golf, skiing, and Randolph-Macon College sports. He has served on the Board of Trustees of the College for seven years, and has chaired the Trustee Committee on athletics. He serves as a past Chair of Manufacturers and Jewelers of America, Past President of Plumb Club of New York, and on the board of Jewelers for Children.

About Craig Stern:

Craig joined Rogers Enterprises during college in 1976 and became President & CEO in 1988. Since joining the company, it has expanded from operating in one state to operating stores in 12 states throughout the Midwest, South and East
